

How to Read this chart:

You can ONLY apply to a consulate if you fall under their jurisdiction. You will qualify for a consulate's jurisdiction if either your permanent home address OR your university's address meets their qualifications for jurisdiction as listed below.

If you are applying based on a permanent address you will have to show proof with a valid driver's license or state ID. If you are applying based on your university's address you will have to show proof via a student ID. Please double check that the consulate you are applying to is still accepting student ID as proof of jurisdiction. Most do, however, consulate rules and regulations do change quite often.

Search for the state and county of either your university or permanent home address in the right column and in the left column you will see which consulate you qualify for. Consulate websites are linked. If the links for the consulate are not working please google "Consulate city Greece Consulate" and then click their visa tab on the website . Ex: "Boston Greece Consulate"
